

## **Summary of GOBR Activities**

### **12<sup>th</sup> Annual Annapolis Good Old Boat Regatta 2011**

#### **Friday October 7**

Skippers' Meeting at 7PM (for an hour to an hour and a half)

Skippers Meeting is at party site, and mandatory for new racers. We use colored ribbon streamers to differentiate starting classes. Skippers will need to pick up their streamers at the skippers meeting. There will also be a run-through of what happens at the start and on the race course for new racers. We use the traditional 5 minute starting sequence rather than the Racing Rule 26 5-4-1 sequence.

#### **Saturday October 8**

Ad Hoc Tender Service - 8 to 9:30AM (approximate) – we may need some AM dinghy help  
Rendezvous for Race - 10:30AM at Hackett Point Can 1 (off Whitehall Bay) for "Follow-me"  
First Gun for Race – 11:30AM. Boats will be starting until about 12:10PM.  
Party Begins – 4PM (or whenever the boats and people get back)  
Race Awards for Saturday – 5:30PM (give or take depending on how scoring goes)  
Music Begins – Whenever our group of GOBR musicians get set up (bring your axe)  
Tender Service - 4 to 9PM (unless, of course, you have a dinghy)

The rendezvous point is about ½ hour from the dock and mooring area.

#### **Sunday October 9**

About the same as Saturday, but we anticipate the party will break up earlier with no late tender service.

#### **General**

If you want to anchor overnight at the GOBR shore site, feel free to do so. It is a well protected creek area. Crew people can come to Sailors Wharf Marina to get on anchored boats.

The marina where we have the meetings and parties is a private residence with a dock and 20 slips. On the creek it is sort of on the end of a row of small marinas and will fly a Good Old Boat Magazine banner on the side of the house just above the marina. Just park in the creek next the marina. Good water depth in the area. ...

All the anchorage space is within a hundred yards of the marina. Please bring a dinghy if you have one. We will have places for you to keep them at the shore line while you are racing. Having a dinghy will give you more flexibility in coming and going on your boat. You can leave the dinghy shore or tie your anchor line to it and leave it out during racing.

We will be serving hors d'oeuvres and beer and wine (with some Dark and Stormies thrown in), but are by no means providing enough food for dinner for everyone. For those without cars, there are delivery type places not far from the site.
